

400. Covert--Daniel (522).. Luke Covert born in New Jersey, came from northern Holland, ancestors sailed on the Puritan and founded town of family name. Luke died in New Jersey. His son Daniel was a gunsmith in Washington's army and contributed loyal and patriotic service to his country. His home in the neighborhood of Monmouth; owned part of land on which the battle was fought. After the revolutionary war emigrated to Ohio, later Kentucky, then Clark county, Indiana in 1797, where Daniel died, 1803. His son Peter died in Clark county, April 15, 1857. Had a large family. One son, Henry, married Mary Cortner, Jan. 5, 1843, and children, Edward, Elijah moved to Jennings county, Indiana; Emaline, Addie, Julia. "History of Clark County," Baird, Page 871.

447. Covert -- Daniel (522). The service of Daniel Covert of this query has been accepted by the national society, Daughters of the American Revolution. Pension No. 10462. List of New Jersey soldiers of the revolution. He was born in Somerset county, New Jersey, 1757, died March 17, 1849, Mercer county, Kentucky. His wife was Jane Mammoth, married in New Jersey. Children, David; Garrett; Ellen, married Colston; Patsey, born 1793, married William Davis 1811. (Note--Indiana records give Daniel Covert buried in Covert family graveyard, six miles northeast of Charlestown, Clark county. This may be the oldest son, David.)
