Roger Smith: Captain Roger Smith, who served in the Netherlands with Thomas West, Lord Delaware, came to Virginia sometime prior to 1616. As soon as he reached Virginia, he began serving on the Council of State. He went to England but returned to the colony in 1621. His military expertise was highly valued, and after the 1622 Indian attack he was given the means and authority to build a fort on the lower side of the James River in Warresqueak. Sometime prior to 1623 Smith married William Peirce's daughter, Joan, who had outlived her former husband, John Rolfe. During 1624 and 1625 Smith played an active role in the Virginia government. He had a home on the waterfront in urban Jamestown but also owned a plantation on the lower side of the James River and some land in Archer's Hope. He was still alive in June 1629 and serving on the Council of State (VI&A 648-649; STAN 30; LEO xxi).
