O. Mathias Wildonger, of Plumstead Township, in the county of Bucks and State of Pennsylvania, being of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and publish this, my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. As to such Estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows, viz: Item, I give and bequeath to my sister Mary Leese, intermarried with George Leese the sum of Two Dollars. Item, I give and bequeath to my sister Rachel Richart intermarried with John Richart, the sum of Two Dollars. Item, I give and bequeath to my Nephew John T. Wildonger a son of my brother John Wildonger, all of my real estate, during his natural life, and the reversion or remainder of the same, after his death to his heirs and assigns forever. The said real Estate is situated in Plumstead Township aforesaid and is in part bounded and described as follows viz: Beginning in the middle of Tohickon Creek thence by Tobias Nash's land South forty one degrees and thirty minutes West three perches to a stone, thence by lot No. 2, North forty eight degrees and a half West sixty six perches to a stone thence by John Tonash's land, North forty one degrees and a half East fifty nine perches to a corner in the middle of Tohickon Creek thence down the several courses thereof to the place of Beginning containing ten acres, Lot No. 2. Beginning at a heap of stones in the line of George Leese's land, thence by the same North fifty degrees, West sixty six perches to a black walnut tree for a corner thence by land of John Tonash, North forty degrees East twenty nine perches and one tenth to a stone thence fifty degrees East sixty six perches to a stone, thence South forty degrees West twenty nine perches and one tenth to the place of Beginning containing twelve acres, more or less, it being the same premises which Jacob Hintner High Sheriff of the County of Bucks by Deed Poll dated September 13th 1827 did grant and convey to me and my heirs and assigns forever. And in consideration of the above bequest the said John T. Wildonger must take care of me the Testator and Eliza Wildonger my Wife during our natural lives and supply us with food, clothing and Medical Attendance if needed and also to pay our funeral expenses. Item, Provided the said John T. Wildonger shall, supply my executor hereinafter named with money sufficient to pay my just debts legacies and funeral expenses and the debts and funeral expenses of my wife Eliza Wildonger as well as money sufficient to file a final settlement of my estate, then and in consequence of his supplying said money I give and bequeath to him the said John T. Wildonger all the rest and residue of my personal estate, whatsoever and whosoever, of what nature, kind and quality soever the same may be and not hereinbefore given and disposed of, to his own use and benefit. Lastly, I appoint my friend John Blemmens of Simicum Township to be the Executor of this my last will and Testament. In Witness Whereof, O. Mathias Wildonger, the testator, here to this my will, written on one sheet of paper, set my hand and seal, this sixteenth day of March A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy two.
