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In the name of Almighty God Amen: - I John Nave of Jessamine County State of Ky being in full health, but of sound disposing mind, sound memory, and calling to mind the certain and awful nature of the death of the mortal body, and being desirous of making a disposition of that Estate, with which a merciful & kind providence in his goodness has thought proper to bless me, I do hereby publish and declare the following to be my last will and testament to wit: In the first place it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid, and funeral expenses be paid out of my Estate. In the second place it is my desire that my Father Samuel Nave who was old and infirm be supported out of my Estate, that a Two hundred dollars be left in Peter Nave's hand, and loaned out to the best advantage & the interest that will arise therefrom be for my Father's support as long as he shall live. It is further my will that all of my real and personal Estate be set up and sold to the highest bidder on a credit that my Executors hereinafter named may think proper. It is my will and desire that Jonathan Nave shall have Two hundred dollars out of my Estate, and that amount to be his portion. I also give my Nephew Solomon Craston One hundred and fifty dollars, and the balance of my Estate to be equally divided among my brothers and sisters that is to wit Peter Nave, Cory Hoover, Michael Nave, Elizabeth Werryman, Susan Cornum and Margaret Dickerson. I do hereby appoint my Brothers Cory Peter Nave & Peter Hoover my Executors to the my last will and Testament, and if either of them should die or refuse to act, the other either with full power to carry into effect the my last will. In Testimony whereof I subscribe my Name & fix my Seal this 8th day of October 1841.
