are held and firmly bound unto their honours the judges of the court of ordinary for said county, and their successors in office, in the just and full sum of

twelve ~~thousand~~ *and* _____ dollars, for the payment of which sum, to the said judges and their successors, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators, in the whole and for the whole sum jointly, and severally, and firmly, by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated this *first* day of *March* 1824.

THE condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bound

of the goods, chattels and credits of *Ludovic Fullilove* late of this county deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said *Willis Fullilove & Elizabeth Fullilove*

or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for ~~the use~~ and the same, so made, do exhibit unto the said court of ordinary, when ~~they~~ shall be thereunto required; and such goods, chattels and credits, do well and truly administer according to law, and do make a just and true account of ~~the~~ actings and doings therein, when ~~they~~ shall be thereunto required by the court of ordinary for said county, and all the rest of the goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first allowed of by the court, shall deliver and pay to such person or persons respectively, as are entitled to the same by law; and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last will and testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved before the court, and the executors obtain a certificate of the probate thereof, and the said
