my Executor hereafter named as soon as conveniently may be to sell all my  
Land and Plantation and the Money arising from the sale thereof and my  
personal Estate to be applied to pay my just Debts and the Expenses above  
mentioned Item I give and bequeath to all my other undischarged Children  
all the余 of my Estate remaining after paying my just Debts and Ex-  
penses above mentioned to be equally divided among them Item I hereby  
nominate and appoint my above mentioned Son Job Porter to be my and  
his Executor of this my Last Will and Testament hereby empowering and  
authorizing him to make Sale of all my Land and Plantation as above di-  
rected hereby empowring him to make a Title or the same according to  
Law Item I do hereby revoke all and every former Will by me made rete-  
ning & confirming this and this only to be my Last Will and Testament
