further the said Thomas his son for the further consideration of the sum of one thousand
to him the said James in hand paid by the said Thomas the receipt whereof
the said James doth hereby acknowledge hath given granted bargained sold
by these presents doth give grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Thomas
the same Logans forever certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and be
in the County of Hopkins and on the waters of a branch of Muddy river
containing one hundred and seventy acres and bounded as followeth: To wit
Beginning at a hickory black gum and larch on the bank of a branch
in a line of said James' original survey of four hundred acres of which
tract hereby conveyed is about thence with said line \$5000 worth to the
hickory and white oak corners of said original survey thence with another line
of the original survey 175 feet so far as that east line to a rock creek bed
said creek to the Beginning will include the quantity of one hundred and
acres with its appurtenances it have and to hold the said tract or parcel of
land containing one hundred and seventy acres as aforesaid with its appurtenances
unto the said Thomas his heirs & to his heirs only forever used and enjoyed
And the said James for himself his heirs & to the said tract or parcel of land
with its appurtenances unto the said Thomas his heirs & to against the claims
of him the said James his heirs executors & assigns and against the
claims of all and every other person & persons whatever claiming or to claim
the same by, thro' or under him or them but against the claim of no other
person will warrant & forever defend

State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said James Logan for and in consideration of the
natural love and affection which he hath been towards the Watty Logan & Nancy Logg wife of
Dr. the said William Kirby the daughter of him the said James Logan and for the further consideration
of the sum of one dollar to him the said James Logan in hand paid by the said Dr. Watty Logan and
Nancy Logg & William Kirby the receipt whereof he the said James Logan doth herby acknowledge
hath given granted bargained and sold and to him granted and given grant bargained
sold and conveyed unto the R. Watty Logan Nancy Logg & William Kirby and their heirs
assigns persons certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County
of Stephenson on the waters of Rockingham Branch river containing two hundred
and thirty acres and bounded as follows & Beginning at a stake and to two
maples in a line of John Harmon's ditch 1110^{ft} running thence 180^{ft} westly to a
cotton tree farm and then on the bank of said creek corner of Thomas Logans
70 acre tract, conveyed to him by James Logg hence up Thomas creek and south
of line of P. Thomas Logg and 10 acre tract to take in a line of James Logg and 10
acre tract & which the tract hereby conveyed is yearly thence with a line of P. Thomas
tract 175^{ft} west to a black oak and next goes corner and 100 acre land and also corner
to Thomas Logg's corner 400^{ft} hence with corner line 180^{ft} to a pole opposite to
corner at 100^{ft} to another oak corner to P. Mary & with Mary line and to Mary
line with Harmon line 100^{ft} to a stake and to the beginning with its appurtenances to James
Logg & Watty Kirby the said tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and thirty acres together
with its appurtenances, with the R. Watty Logan Nancy Logg & William Kirby their heirs &
to their assigns persons and assigns to take the said James Logan for himself his heirs
