 knowing that it is appointed for man once
 to die and being desirous to let my temporal
 affairs in order therefore do constitute and
 ordain this my last will and testament in
 manner & form following (that is to say)
 First & principally I Recommend my
 soul into the hands of ^{almighty God} who gave it me,
 & my body I commit to the Earth from which
 it was taken to be buried in decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my hereafter
 named Executors and at the expense of
 my estate & to such worldly goods as it
 shall please God to bestow in this life
 with, I dispose of the same as follows
 In giving my share in the first place I do
 give my said debt to be paid out of my
 Estate then I bequeath my beloved wife Sarah
 Prince the whole of my Estate after paying
 of my debts during her natural life and at her
 death I leave to my Daughter Elizabeth &
 my Daughter Susan all my said Estate
