 great duty incumbent on me before I goe out of this World
 to sett all things to right betwixt God and my own Soule: To
 also wth respect to y^e Little Estate y^e God hath ben pleased
 to give me: To leave it so as y^e I may avoid Contention
 amongst my Surviving Relacions if it may be hoping that wth I
 shall here do with the blessing of God may effect the same:
 Therefore not knowing y^e day of my dissolution: but being
 now in perfect understanding doe by these presents declare that
 what I shall hereunder write is my Last will and Testament
 and doe by these presents constitute, Ordain and appoint my beloved
 wife Elizabeth Andros and my Youngest Sonn Joseph Andros to be
 Joynt Executors of this my Last will and Testament: And so when
 it shall pleas God to Call me away by death I will my Body to y^e
 Grave and my Spirit to God that gave it: and after my just
 debts and debts buriall is discharged I give and bequeath to my
 beloved wife all that part of my Estate that Can or may be deemed
 household stuff or goods to be to her and to be disposed of as she
 shall see cause - Also I give to my before mentioned wife
 one third part of all my horned Cattle and Sheep to Empreeve
 for her maintenance while she Lives: and to dispose of

My her deat^h as she shall see need, Furthermore I give to my
 Wife y^e us of one third part of my dwelling House Barne &
 Orchard pastur^e land & all other my improved Land during the time
 of her naturall life and then to returne to my Sonne Joseph - I
 give to my three Sons Samuel, William and Nathaniel Andros
 to possess what I have already given them all my Second Division
 Land which is three hundred twenty seven Acres to be equally divi-
 ded between them Also to my Sonne Samuel that two Acres of
 homlott land which I had of Zachariah Hgw and Houls upon it
 also three Acres at a place Called the Red Rock Tripping to Doct^r John
 Hull his Land also ten acres at W^{est} End of the Lett at a place
 Called Chornutt ground and two Acres at y^e Old plaine field also I
 give to my Sonne William five acres of Land called regulacion and
 four acres of land w^{ch} y^e Town granted me in way of Exchange for
 land at y^e Lower end of misery swamp. Also I give to my Son
 Nathaniel five acres of first division Land at a place Called the
 Ash Swamp, also five Acres of regulacion Land and four acres
 w^{ch} I had granted in Exchange from doggs misery which his House
 stands on all the Land given to my 3rd Sons Samuel, William and
 Nathaniel to be to them their Heirs & assigns for ever. The
 remainder of all my Land, buildings, Orchard, Pasture Land, Impro-
 ved Land, wood Land, upland, meadow Land, first division first
 division in possession or in reversion I give to my Son Joseph
 to be to him his Heirs & assigns for ever, and having already
 given to my Sons Samuel, William and Nathaniel Andros their pro-
 portion of Cattle & other moveable estate, and having in y^e former Com-
 p^oment^{ly} endowed my Wife: I give to my Son Joseph all the remainder
 of my moveable estate as Cattle, sheep, Swine, Carts, ploughs, axes, hoes &
 tools, w^{ch} ever can be found to be my estate to be and remaine
 to my Son Joseph Andros also y^e my Son Joseph shall have Liberty
 to have two oxen and a Horse as part of his two thirds of the Cattle and
 y^e my Son Joseph shall take Care of his mother and to help her to man-
 age her while she remaine a widow Also I give to my Daughters
 Elizabeth, Mary, Margore & Dinah each of them thirty Shillings in
 Cattle or other pay to be paid by my Executors within the space
 of two years after my deat^h besides what I have formerly bestowed on
 them to wit and to all y^e premises & the before named Sam^l Andros have
 sett to my hand and Seale this seventeenth day of April one thousand seven
 hundred and three
