

The 1st of 3^d month June 1692

In the name of God Amen John Willis son of the Town of Bridgewater in Colony
of New Plymouth in New England being by his hand of God of sound judgment and
memory do ordaine and make my last will and Testament as follows after this style
doth ordaine and constitute my son Nathanael Willis to be my true and lawful Ex-
ecutor & Trusty my debts being paid and of cost of my funeral discharged I Give unto
my son John Willis the ten acres of land his half shares in and my share of thirteenth acres
of land lying below Tiverton together with ten acres of land yet unlay'd and All which I
Give to him and his heirs for ever. I further Give unto my son Nathanael Willis my
Buckling house Orchard and barns with the whole twenty five acres of land adjoining
thereto from of my rents of plow land and pastur that exceedeth between my sons Benjamin
sons land and mine and as far as it concerneth of East side of Benjamin's side beyond
the Wolf bay River Only that is at this present time within Benjamins fence
to remain Benjamins All my white Houshold I Give unto my son Nathanael him and
his heirs for ever together with ten acres on the other side of Buckleystaff river
lying betwixt my orchard and Nathanael's ground. And therefore and for aforesaid
my far fields or meadow to runn with Eleventh acres of Cedar Ground and four
acres at Middle Brook between John Ames and Saml Eason together with half one
Shant of Cedar Ground at Buckleystaff point And half a shant of Cedar Ground
of bought of Nicholas Pyman And my two lots of meadow one in Easters Kitchen
and the other in Ceres Land with all my undivided land that belongs unto my per-
son in of Town with my ploughland West and all the Tidell belonging thereto
only let it be remembred that after his Decease the Seventy acres of the far fields to
divide unto his three sons Nathanael Jonathan and John. I Give unto Nathanael
thirty acres with two lots that I bought of his father at Tiverton And to his
son Jonathan twenty acres and twenty unto his son John All which I Give
and Bequeath unto my son Nathanael and his children to him and his an-
dise for ever I Give unto my son Joseph Willis during his life fifteen acres of
the far fields that side next Tiverton And five and twenty acres of my last
fifty acres that is yet to be lay'd out And after his Decease unto his Eldest Son Joseph
to him his heirs and assigns for ever I Give unto my Son Comfort my sixteen
acres at the Indiam field for it mount or less And the ten acres on the other side of
River Buckling on his homelands And five acres joining unto of Southwicks field
of his Houshold And a lot of meadow in the Great meadow and half my share
of Cedar Ground at Buckleystaff point and half my undivided land that belongs
unto my purchase All which I Give unto him and his heirs for ever. I Give
unto my son Benjamin my two lots at Tiverton and the ten acres lay'd out

to his hand in y' goods to him his heirs for Ente & Give unto my Eldest Daughter
 Hannah Hayward my feather Bed & byr on with of y' Belonging therunto And my lesser
 Bed unto my Daughter Elizabeth Harvey with the Coverlet and Blanket. & Give
 unto my Grandchilde present to her one of my Cows And my Bible And all the rest
 of my Goods and Chattels to be equally diuid Betwix my three Daughters Hannah
 Hayward Sarah Anne And Elizabeth Harvey In witness whereof I set to
 my hand and seal this seventeenth day of y' sixth month August 1692.

Willis late of Bridgewater deceased the said presents pronounced were present approved and
likewise who having written his will and at the time of his death God's Childrens rights and
Credit the said Decease and his will in any manner concerning was committed unto his
son Nathanael Operator in ^{the} said will named well and truly to administer ^{the} same
and to make a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singulare of Gods Childrens rights and
Credit of ^{the} said Decease and of same to Exhibitiants of Register office of ^{the} said County
according to law also to returne a true and plaine account of his said Administration
written with ^{the} selfe same whereof I have hereunto set my hand and ^{the} seal of ^{the} office
