

In the Name of God Amen

I Frederick Stover of Paradise Township, County of York and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania yeoman being at present weak and sick in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same and Considering the uncertainty of Human life, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, and first and principally recommending my Immortal Spirit into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, trusting through the Merits of my redeemer for goodness of all my sins and an happy admission into the Bliss and Immortality, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after named, and as to such worldly Estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same in manner and form following, first it is my Will that all my just debts and funeral Expences be paid off as soon as conveniently may be after my decease by my Executors hereafter named. Item It is my Will that all the money which shall be found after my decease shall be equally divided amongst my four children, To viz; Michael Stover, Adam Stover, George Stover and Christina Stover. — Item I give and Bequeath unto my son Michael Stover one Mare and the young horse with the gears thereunto belonging besides a bay Mare and two cows and one Calf which I have already given him by my life time as also one new Waggon if the same is not finished by my life time then the said Waggon is to be made out of my personal Estate, Item I give and bequeath unto each of my before named four children one Cow and two Sheep and if any of my said Children should not get a Cow and two Sheep such a Child shall have in lieu for a Cow four pound, and for the two Sheep twenty shillings I give and bequeath unto my Son Adam Stover two mares with the gears thereunto belonging, I further give unto each of my Sons Michael and Adam Stover one plow and the Waggon cloth and Serson they shall keep jointly, I further give unto my Son Adam Stover the old Waggon and to my Son Michael the Windmill. — It is further my Will that all the grain which shall be found after my decease shall be sold by my Executors the money arising out of the sale thereof shall be equally divided amongst my four Children namely, Michael, Adam, George and Christina, it is further my Will that four bushels of Apples which are to be still

shall be for the use when a barn is build for my son Adam. Item
 I give, devise, dispose and bequeath unto my two Sons Michael Stover
 and Adam Stover and to their heirs and assigns my now dwelling
 Plantation whereupon I now live situated lying and being in
 Paradise Township aforesaid adjoining Lands of Peter Bruff, &
 Randolph Blimpeter, Jacob Stover, George Meyer, Henry Spang-
 ler and Barnard Spangler containing four Hundred and
 Eighty six Acres of Land and Allowance by the same more
 or less, to have and to hold the said tract of Land of Four
 Hundred and Eighty six Acres and Allowance to them my
 said two Sons and to their heirs and assigns forever. —
 Yielding and Paying therefore unto my Children George Stover,
and Christina Stover the sum of Eight Hundred Pounds in
Real Gold and Silver money. And it is further my Will
 that my Son Michael Stover shall pay his share of
 Eight Hundred Pounds which is Four Hundred Pounds —
 to my Daughter Christina and to her heirs and assigns
 and my Son Adam Stover shall pay his Four Hundred
 Pounds in Real Gold and Silver money to my Son —
 George Stover and to his heirs and assigns, And it is further
 my will that my aforesaid Two Sons each of them pay
 Twenty five pounds each the first payment whereof to be made
 on the fifteenth Day of April One Thousand Seven-
 hundred and Ninety five, and so on yearly untill each of
 them hath fully paid and discharged the sum of Four-
 hundred Pounds, It is further my will and I do order that
 my said Plantation shall be divided as equally as can be
 by three honest freeholders out of the Neighbourhood, provided
 that my Son Michael shall have the Buildings —
 where I now live, and my Son Adam the new House where
 he that said Adam now lives, provided that my Son Adam
 shall be intitled to Two Rows of Apple Trees during the
 term of Ten Years, And further It is my will, And I do —
 order that who ever of my Two Sons shall get the lower
 part of the meadow shall be intitled to the water, for
 watering the meadow, that is to say Michael who will
 get the upper part of the meadow shall have the use
 of the water for Twenty four Hours, and then Adam
 shall have the use for the same time and so to continue

during the whole year but the ditches they shall dig and
 clean together and also the Dam or any water works for the use
 of watering the meadows they shall make and maintain
 together, and keep the same in Repair he the said Adam Stover his
 heirs and assigns shall have full Liberty for Entry and Repairs on
 the part of Michael Stover's meadow to lead the said Water for
 the rest of the Meadow without molestation or hindrance of the
 said Michael Stover his heirs or assigns, I do further order, That in
 case my Son Adam Stover should not pay my Son George Stover,
 according to the Terms within mentioned, and just Title should
 become due to him and the same are not discharged, Then it is
 my will that the said Tract of Land shall as the same is de-
 nied from the whole tract be the Property of my Son George Stover,
 to hold the same for himself his heirs and assigns forevermore
 but the said George shall pay unto the said Adam Stover his
 heirs and assigns the aforesaid sum of Two Hundred Pounds
 in the same Payments as before mentioned. Item, I give
and bequeath unto my Sons Nicholas Stover, Philip Stover,
Henry Stover and Jacob Stover the sum of Fifteen Hundred
Pounds to be equally divided & have and share alike, which I have
already in hand had not done, The first sum of Three Hundred
Pounds will be due the fifteenth Day of April next and then
Sixty Pounds the fifteenth Day of April One Thousand and Seven
Hundred and Ninety five, and so on every Year until the
whole sum of Fifteen Hundred Pounds is fully paid.
Item, I give and bequeath unto my Son Nicholas Stover,
the further sum of Sixty Pounds to be taken out of a sum
due from Henry Stover above his equal share and the remainder
of the sum shall be divided and paid in equal shares unto my
Sons Nicholas, Philip Henry and Jacob, I further give
and bequeath unto my Daughter Christiana the sum of
Five Pounds over and above the Legacy already bequeathed
to her. And as to the rest and residue of all my Personal Estate
of what kind or nature soever which I have not bequeathed
before, I do order that the same shall be sold by Executors at
Publick Vendue that all my surviving Heirs and Executors shall be equally
divided amongst my four children Michael, George, and Christine
And I do hereby declare that all and every the Legacies and
Bequests herein contained shall be in full of their respective

I have both Real and Personal And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my trusty friends Jacob Stover and Peter Buff, Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former will and wills by me theretofore made, & declaring this and no other my final and effectual and to be my Last Will and Testament. And Testimony whereof the said Frederick Stover have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Second Day of January, anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty four (Anno Domini MDCCLXIV) Year of our Lord 1734
 N.B. The wood (thereof) interlined before signing and the wood (right) written on a Paper, Signed, Sealed, Published, pronounced and declared by the said Testator, as and for his Last Will and Testament in the presence of us who have subscribed our names as Witnesses thereto in the presence of, and at the request of the said Testator. Abraham Roth, John Miller

York County, Pa. Before me Jacob Barnard Regt Register for the Probate of Wills and granting Letters of Administration and for the County of York in the State of Pennsylvania, afforwardly came Abraham Roth one of the Subscribing Witnesses to the foregoing Instrument of writing, and on his solemn affirmation, (he concurringly renouncing the taking of an oath,) Roth say that he was personally present and saw and heard the above named Frederick Stover sign his manuscript and Seal and establish the foregoing Instrument of writing as and for his Last Will and Testament. And that at the time of the doing thereof, the Frederick Stover was of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding to the best of his known knowledge and belief; and that he subscribed his name thereto as a witness in that presence of the said Testator, and at his request. And further that he also saw John Miller the other witness sign his name thereto as a witness at the same time. Abraham Roth.
