Peter Clester's
Will.

In the Name of God. Amen. The twenty-first day of August in the year of our Lord 1795; I Peter Clester of Elk Lick Township, Bedford County, and State of Pennsylvania being very sick and weak in body, but of sound minde and memory; therefore calling to minde that it is accustomed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I recommend my soul unto God that gave it, and my body I recommend to be buried after a christian like and decent manner, at the directions of my Executors, and touching my worldly estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of in the following manner & form.

First, I constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Christiana Clester to be my whole Executor, over my real and personal property and estate, and I also give and bequeath unto her all that I have in America to dispose of. She is also to maintain all her children the boys is to be put learn breads as soone as the becom of the age of seventeen years; also is to give the boys and girls Penning to read and write, and if my wife Christiana Clester should see cause to marry after my death, I do by this my will debar and forbidd her from bearing or executing any part of my Estate either real or personal.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to oddest daughter Christiana Clester, the sum of five shillings to be her whole dower out of my estate in America, and if any of my estates

estate should be recovered from Germany I desire it should be divided equally between my wife and children as tenants in common. - In witness of this my last Will & Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year first above written.

of Peter Clester late of the said County deceased, (a true copy whereof is to these presents annexed) having whilst he lived, and at the time of his death, divers goods, chattels, rights and credits within the said Commonwealth; by reason whereof the approbation and insinuation of the said last Will and Testament, and the committing the administration of all and singular the Goods, chattels, rights and credits which were of the said deceased, and also the auditing the accounts, calculations and reckonings of the said Administration, and a final dismissal from the same to me are manifestly known to belong; and that administration of all and singular the Goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, any way concerning his last Will and Testament, was committed to the Anna Clester in the said Testament named she having first been sworn, well and truly to administer the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, and make a true and perfect Inventory thereof, and exhibit the same into the Register's office at Somerset on or before the second day of November next, and to render a true and just account calculation and reckoning of the said Administration on or before the second day of October in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety six.
