St Pauls Lutheran Church at Strasburg Virginia is believed to be the location of the graves of Christian Sen and his wife Ann Mary. Christian Neuberger Sen owning 2 acre lots in the town of Strasburg Virginia, June 28 1787 at the time of his death.

Christian Neighbarger: Ship> Patience.. Captain>> Hugh Steele arrived in America in 1750. The journey to America began in a small boat down the Rhine River to a Dutch Port and a stop off at a Navy Port of call, to wait for a wind to cross the Atlantic Ocean, the trip was marked with hardship, passengers were densely packed, storms added to the woe, when at last the Delaware River in America was reached and the subjects were

asked to then take the oath of allegiance. The land in which they arrived was to be called Pennsylvania and many thousands of Germans, Dutch, Swiss and others were to settle and find a new home in America: This is from a Plaque on the wall of Frances Nybarger, Wheelwright, who is now deceased. It was read over the phone by her husband, Jack, September 2 1981>> DAR Patriot has been claimed and Accepted by the Daughters of the American Revolution, for services rendered to the cause. The following from the Records of Clyde Neibarger of 920 NW 22nd. Oklahoma City, Okla., Sept 23 1940.

Neibarger, Christian, Germanic, arrived Aug 11 1750 on the ship Patience, captain Hugh Steel

In Germany it is said that the name of Nieberger means a mountain Villager.

Will of Christian Neiberger, Shenandoah County, Virginia, 1787. The records of deeds at Woodstock shows that Christian Neighbarger of county Dunmore on May 3 1777, paid twelve pounds for Lots 156 and 33 in Strasburg, from Peter Stover and his wife, Frainey.

This was the year after the Colonies began a revolt against the reign of King George III in the Spirit of 76, The sum involved in these deals was the Equivalent of \$ 60.00 in 1940. County Dunmore was changed in 1777 to Shenandoah County, so this establishes Christian Neiberger senior, as a resident of that area 13 years before the birth of his twin sons, Christian and Jacob, in Winchester Virginia in 1764.

The Strasburg lots no 33 and 155 were sold to Jacob Neuberger for 100 pounds this was 3 days after the Will of Christian Sen. Jacob Neuberger the (Twin of Christian Jr.), and his wife, and Christian Jr. sold the said lots to David Stickley Oct 19 1815. In Wayland's History of Shenandoah County, an entry under the name of Nieberger gives Christian's name as a householder, with

There was no Will just the Adminstration record. Rev War records published by the Daughters of the American Revolution - Ohio: Christian Neighbarger, Jr. lived in Shenandoah Co, Virgina until 1787, to Hardy Co Virginia til 1797, back to Shenandoah Co Va til 1805, to Monongalia co Va (W VA) til 1815, to Licking County Ohio, on November 1832 went to Logan County Ohio. Served in the War of the Revolution under Capt. Brown's regt. watching the movements and camps of General Cornwallis. He received a Pension for his service in the Rev War while residing in Logan County Ohio of \$150.00 a year until his death. His application papers were signed by his brothers, Jacob Neighbarger and Christopher Nieghbarger The affidavit signed by Jacob W Neighbarger: The State of Ohio, Licking County, came before me, John Leivern, one of the justices of the peace from said County, personally came Jacob Neighbarger who being duly sworn according to have disposeth and saith that Christian Neighbarger served as private, Soldier in the Revolutionary war, in behalf of these United States first three months in the Spring of 1771 Joined the company at Strasburg, Virginia, Shenandoah County thence marched to or near Winchester, Frederick County, State aforesaid and served there three months guarding the Prisoners, and the aforsaid Christian Neighbargerwas called on and in the summer of 1781 and was Discharged five days before the surrender of Cornwallis and served three months in that campaign as he verily and further states thee exptant saitah an sworn to and subscribed before me. At the County aforesaid this 30th day of September A D 1833. John Leivern, Justice of the Peace, signed Jacob Neighbarger(X) his mark. This is to certify that I am and have been acquainted a number of years and I believe the aforesaid Jacob Neighbarger to be a man of truth. About Seventy- Five years of age with a good recollection and can be relied on. signed John Leivern Justice of the Peace. #10

There is no further record of Catherine that we can find other than she is believed to be of MULUENGON descent and apparently died shortly after coming to Ohio sometime around 1815 possibly in child birth as son, Samuel died, in 1815. Would like to solve this mystery.
