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To all to whom these presents shall come, I, James
22 February 1838 Jackson Co., TN

do hereby certify that by virtue of Act No. 2390 passed in the office of the Clerk of the County of Jackson Tennessee and entered on the 22 day of August 1838 pursuant to the provisions of an act of the General Assembly of this State passed on the 21 day of January 1838, the said Act, that the State of Tennessee unto John Lewis a certain tract or parcel of land containing eleven acres and twenty fathoms, by being divided into the 8. day of September 1838 lying within the County on the north of Cumberland River and within the fork of Bulfinch Creek; beginning at two Oaks and a Buckhorn William Ray's corner boundary line, thence South with said line forty fathoms to a Beech, the South East Corner of said Ray's tract and in a straight line with boundary line thence West with said line forty fathoms to three Beeches in James M. Doniphan's East boundary line forty fathoms to two fathoms and in a straight line thence South West Corner in the name of John Lewis to the Beginning - with the same boundaries and appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said John Lewis and his heirs forever. In witness whereof Newton Cannon, Governor of the State of Tennessee has hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed at Nashville on the 22 day of February 1838 and 62 years of our Independence.

To all to whom these presents shall come Having Shown that for
 and in Consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars paid to the office
 of the County Clerk of Jackson County and entered on the 15. day
 of December 1837 Pursuant to the provisions of an act
 of the General Assembly of this State passed on the 31. day of
 December 1835 by Ch. 12 by which it was enacted by the
 said State of Tennessee unto John Seisco assigned
 of John Seisco a certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty
 five acres by survey bearing date the 22. day of August 1836
 lying in said County on the north side of Cumberland River begin-
 ning at two small bejums in the forks of Bullard's Creek; then
 southwesterly through the said bejums east bearing line 85 poles and
 5/8 of a pole to a stake and honey locust point to
 two bejums and two of a piece in said line - then east 4 1/2
 poles to two oaks and a beech in the line of the west boundary line
 then north westerly said line 85 poles and 5/8 pole to a stake and
 honey locust point to the west 4 1/2 poles to the beginning, with
 the here to contents and appurtenances, to have and
 to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appur-
 tenances to the said John Seisco and his heirs forever.

 caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed at Nashville
 on the 23. day of February 1838 and 6. year of our
 Independence
