The OLYPHANT immigrant ancestor was Dr. David OLYPHANT. He fought on the field of Culloden, fied to America and his estates at Perth, Scotland were forfeited. On fleeing from Scotland Dr. David OLYPHANT changed the spelling of his name from OLIPHANT to OLYPHANT. In 1776 he espoused the cause of the Patriots and was Surgeon-General in Gen. Nathaniel GREEN'S command, of the Continental Army.

William TURNER'S Company, Falls Fight, 1676; m. (firstly) 1650, Joanna, surname unknown, who d. at Hadley 14th September, 1666; m. (second) 9th May, 1667, Abigail TERRY, b. 21st September, and bapi. 27th September, 1646, dau. of Stephen TERRY, of Windsor, Connecticut, a member of the first troop of cavalry established in New England.
