In The Name of God Amen I Henry Brock of the County of Shenandoah in the State of Virginia do by these Presents make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth to Wit To-wit: It is my Will that all my just debts and funeral Charges shall be paid out of my Personal Estate by my Executors, further it is my Will and I do give and bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Mary during her Natural Life the One third of my Real and Personal Estate and also the Choise of One Bed & Furniture, and One Chest and all her Linnen and whatever Furniture she may or can put in her Chest, also I give and Bequeath to my said Wife Mary over and above the One third of my Estate heretofore willed unto her, A Horse or Mare to the Value of twenty five Pounds current money of Virginia as also a Womans Saddle and Bridle, Two Cows And further I do give and Bequeath unto my son Michael One hundred and Eighteen Acres of Land being Part of the Plantation whereon I now Live and adjoining the Lands of Michael Neas, Rudolph Brock and Christian Meyer to be divided from the Land hereafter Willed unto my son Jacob according to a division Line run by Jacob Rinker which said One hundred and eighteen Acres of Land as before described I give and bequeath unto my said son Michael his heirs and assigns for ever but nevertheless the same shall be subject to my wife Marys Power Further It is my Will and I do give and Bequeath unto my son Jacob all the remaining Part of my Land not before Willed Containing One hundred and four Acres to him my said son Jacob his heirs and assigns for ever But Subject to my wife Marys Power and further it is my Will that my said son Jacob his heirs or Executors shall Pay In consideration of my having Willed him the aforesaid Land To each of my Daughters hereafter Named Their heirs or assigns fifteen Pounds That is to say to my Daughter Magdalena my said son Jacob shall Pay fifteen Pounds one year after my Death or in Case of the Decease of my son Jacob then his heirs or Executors shall pay the same further my said son Jacob his heirs or Executors shall Pay two years after my death unto my Daughter Christina or her legal heirs fifteen Pounds further my said son Jacob his heirs or assigns shall Pay three years after my Death fifteen Pounds unto my Daughter Juliana her heir or legal representatives further my said son Jacob his heirs or Executors shall Pay four years after my Death unto my Daughter Susannah her heirs or legal representatives fifteen Pounds further my son Jacob shall Pay five years after my death unto my Daughter Barbara her heirs or legal representatives fifteen Pounds in Case of my said sons death his heirs shall pay said Legacy.

said Legacy, And further my said son Leah his heirs or Executors
 shall pay six years after my Death unto my Daughter Leah her heirs
 or Legal Representatives fifteen pounds. Further I do give and bequeath
 unto my son Rudolph Brock his heirs or assigns the sum of five shillings
 to be paid out of my Personal Estate, I having made a deed to him
 for some Land which is all my said son Rudolph his heirs shall have
 of my Estate, further it is my Will and I do give and bequeath all
 the remaining Part of my Personal Estate which was not named before
 Willed unto my children Henry, Abraham, George, Mary, Catharina
Sarah, Magdalena, Christina, Juliana, Isannah, Barbara, and Lea to
 be equally divided amongst them or their respective heirs or representatives
 further I do constitute and appoint my Trusty Friends and Neighbors
Adam Nease and Jacob Siegel to be Executors of this my Last Will
 and Testament Renouncing, recalling, and revoking all other Wills
 and Wills Testament & Testaments and declaring this to be my
 Last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this twenty first day of May One thousand
 Seven hundred & Ninety five
