Population Grows

Between 1804 and 1810 more than twenty families moved into the military lots of Tyre. Of those most active in the township's affairs, other than the ones mentioned earlier, were Benjamin Nearpass, Simeon Cuddeback, Dr. Thomas Magee, James Stevenson, Nicholas Traver, Samuel Lay, Elijah Chalker, Henry White, Moses Marsh, Stephen Rogers, James Russell, John Hutchins. Many of these families have descendants still living in Tyre today.

Of Asa Smith's 11 children, 3 died in infancy. Lydia married David Chalker (1812); Sally and Harriet married cousins, both named John Selfridge (1813 and 1823); Nancy married Halsey Whitchead (1817); Rebecca Serepta married Elijah Chalker (1837); Eunice, the oldest, died unmarried in 1812. Of the two sons, Jason married Sarah Wells of Alexander, N. Y. (1824), and following her death, married Amanda Lemmon of Varick, N. Y. (1834); Asa, his 2nd son, married Rosetta Benson (1824).

When Asa Smith died in 1841, he had 16 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren. There are 17 Smiths buried in the old Traver Cemetery. Sarah Traver, mother of young Nicholas, and Asa's, aunt, was the first burial in that long-neglected place.
