34. CAPT. FRANCIS ⁵ (*Stephen*,⁴ *William*,³ *Francis*,² *John* ¹), born in Boxford Feb. 12, 1721; married Nov. 18, 1742, Mary Brown.

Lived in Boxford until 1764, when he removed to the St. John River, in that part of Nova Scotia which in 1784 was set off as New Brunswick. He settled at a place which was afterwards called Mauderville, in Sunbury county, being with his sons-in-law, James Symonds and James White, among the pioneer English settlers in that portion of New Brunswick.

Captain Francis had command of a company in the French and Indian War. He participated in the attack on Ticonderoga, in July, 1759. At the end of the season his company returned home. In the next year his company was in the expedition against Canada by way of Albany and Lake Champlain. After the surrender of the French at Chambly it returned to Ticonderoga, and marched thence to Boxford across country, arriving about the first of December. He died Oct. 27, 1771.
