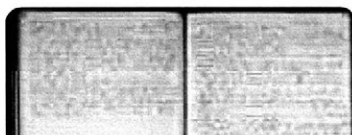

Dilmanton.

In the Name of God: Amen.

I, John F. Battis, of Dilmanton, in the County of Belknap State of New Hampshire, considering the uncertainty of life, but being of a sound and perfect mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament, hereby disposing of all my worldly estate.

First I desire that all just debts and charges against my estate be paid.

Second I desire that suitable headstones for myself and for my late wife shall be erected.

Third I give and devise to my daughter Malvina Gault, all my real estate during her life, and from and after the termination of her estate, to her children and their heirs.

Fourth I give and bequeath to my son John H. Battis, my yoke of oxen and cart.

Fifth I give and bequeath to my daughter Malvina Gault, one cow, one bed and one bureau, and all other household furniture.

Sixth I give and bequeath to my son in law, George H. Haskell, the sum of one dollar.

Seventh I give and bequeath the residue of my estate to my children, John H. Battis and Malvina Gault.

I hereby appoint William D. P. Sanderson of Dilmanton Co. of Belknap executor of this my last will & testament hereby making any and all former will or wills by me made.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this eighth day of March A. D. 1911
