Henry, John

m. Elizabeth Bowers

He served in the American militia, but his wife was a messenger for the British. Loyalist Claims, XXVI, 72.

Henry, Malcolm

S16866

b. 21 December 1755, Rowan County, N.C.

d. 24 April 1840

While residing in York District, he enlisted during June 1776 under Capt. William Byers and Col. Thomas Neel. From the fall of 1776 to the fall of 1778, he was engaged in scouting parties. Late in 1778, he enlisted under Capt. Richard Sadler and Col. Neel for five months. He moved to North Carolina and was active as a scout. In May 1780, he became a captain of a North Carolina unit and was in the battles at Ramsour's Mill and Kings Mountain. (Moved to Miss., Tenn., and N. C.) A.A.3539; I285.

Henry, Michael

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 24 January 1776 and deserted on 29 July 1776. N.A.853.

Henry, Philip

He enlisted in the Sixth Regiment on 25 March 1776. N.A.853.

Henry, Samuel

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 24 January 1776. N.A.853.

Henry, Stephen

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 21 December 1776 and transferred to the First Regiment in February 1780. N.A.246; N.A.853.

Henry, William

b. Augusta County, Va.

m. Isabella McKeown

He lived three miles from Kings Mountain and with his four sons, he fought in the battle there. McCall, II, 64.

Hensley, Joseph

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 17 March 1777. N.A.853.

Hensley, Samuel

See Samuel Hensleys.

Hensleys, Samuel

m. Mary _____

He served as a horseman and died in service. A.A.3541; Y1232; Annuitants Claims.

Henson, Archibald (Archey)

He enlisted in the Sixth Regiment on 7 May 1776. He served three hundred thirty-five

days in the militia during 1780. A.A.3542; Q124; N.A.853.

Henson, Denny

He enlisted in the Sixth Regiment on 7 May 1776. N.A.853.

Henson, Jesse

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 27 January 1777 under Capts. John Hennington and Robert Lyle. He served in the Second Dragoons under Capt. Isaac Ross, Col. Charles Myddleton and Gen. Sumter during 1781. Salley, Doc., p. 84; A.A.3543; M433; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Henson, John

He served in the state troops under Lt. Col. Samuel Hammond. A.A.3543A; M57.

Henson, Obediah

He served in the militia during 1781. A.A.3544; Q496.

Henson, Philip

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 18 August 1777. N.A.853.

Henson, Robert

R4902

b. 25 December 1751/1757, Fauquier County, Va.

He volunteered during 1781 under Col. Brandon and was in the battle at Kings Mountain, where he was wounded.

Henson, William

He served in the Second Regiment during 1777 and was a corporal in 1778. He was under Capt. Thomas Dunbar during 1779. Saffell, p. 293; N.A.853.

Henson, William

He served as a fifer in the Third Regiment under Capt. Joseph Warley during 1779. S.C.H. &G., V, 148.

Henston, Dennis

He served in the Rangers under Captain E. Richardson and Col. Thomson during 1775. S.C.H.&G., I, 121.

Hensy, George

He served in the First Regiment under Capt. William Cattell during 1775. S.C.H.&G., I, 52.

Heran, John

He served in Sumter's brigade. Salley, Doc., p. 7.

Herbert, Michael

See Michael Hubert.

He served as a captain from 16 September 1779 to 12 May 1780 in the militia and was wounded during the siege of Savannah. In 1782, he was a major and may have become a colonel. Heitman, p. 312; Howe, p. 311; A.A.3913; V502; V516.

Hutson, William

He served fifty-nine days alternately in the militia from 1780 to 1782 under Capt. Wilson. A.A.3914; O512.

Hutto, Henry

He enlisted in the First Regiment on 4 November 1775 and became a corporal on 7 March 1778. He was discharged on 10 August 1778. N.A.853.

Hutto, Henry S38057

He served from April 1777 under Capt. Benjamin Cattell and Cols. William Cattell and Pinckney. In addition, he was in the Third Regiment under Capt. Jesse Baker and became a corporal under Capt. Oliver Towles on 1 August 1779. After being taken prisoner at the fall of Charleston, he was exchanged. He joined Col. George Lenington. (Moved to Ga.) S.C.H.&G., V, 152; A.A.3915A; Y794; N.A.246; N.A.853.

Hutto, Isaac

He served sixteen days in the militia during 1781 under Gen. Marion. In addition, he served seventy days as a sergeant in the militia. A.A.3916; S576; S577.

Hutto, Jacob

He served forty-one days in the militia. A.A.3917; S575.

Hutton, Charles

He served in the Second Regiment after 13 January 1776 and was under Capt. Peter Gray and Col. Marion during 1779. Saffell, p. 291; N.A.853; N.A.246.

Hutton, George

He served as a fifer in the Third Regiment. N.A.853.

Hutton, George

He served in the Second Regiment during 1777. S.C.H.&G., XVI, 30.

Hutton, George

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 12 March 1776 and became a fifer on 23 April 1776. N.A.853.

Hutton, John

He served one hundred five days in the militia from 1779 to 1783 under Capt. Joseph Calhoun. A.A.3918; O518.

Hutton, Martin

He enlisted in the First Regiment on 4 November 1775 and re-enlisted during December 1776. N.A.853.

Hutton, William

He served as a lieutenant under Capt. John Bowie and General Williamson during 1776. During 1779, he was a captain under Col. Pickens and was in the battle at Briar Creek. A.A.3919; (Manson, William, W8423).

Hutton, William

He served in the militia from 1779 to 1783 under Captain Joseph Calhoun. A.A.3919; O517; P64.

Huxford, Haslow (Harlock)

He served fifty-three days in the militia during 1782 under Gen. Marion. A.A.3920; Q142.

Hyatt, Arthur

He enlisted in the Fourth Regiment on 30 September 1776. N.A.853.

Hyatt, Jacob

He served in the light dragoons under Capt. John Mills, Lt. Col. Henry Hampton and Gen. Sumter during 1781. 2DD8.

Hybart, John

He enlisted during August 1775 in the Charleston Volunteer Militia under Captain Charles Drayton. S.C.H.&G., I, 135, 187.

Hyde, Stephen

He served ten months in the state troops from 10 December 1781, possibly under Lt. Col. Henry Thomson and Gen. Sumter. In addition, he supplied two horses for military use. A.A.3922; X447.

Hyde, William

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 17 December 1776. He served under Capt. Daniel Mazyck before deserting on 15 October 1779. S.C.H.&G., XVI, 30; Saffell, p. 294; N.A.853.

Hyett, William

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 9 November 1777. N.A.853.

Hyrne, Edmund Massingbird BLWt 1478-400 d. 11 December 1783

He became a captain in the First Regiment on 17 June 1775 and was a major on 12 May 1779. In 1781, he became an aide-de-camp to Gen. Greene and served as deputy adjutant-general of the Southern Department from 17 November 1778 to the end of the war. He was wounded at Charleston on 30 March 1780.
