In the Name of God Amen. I John Vick of Nash County and State of North Carolina being old and infirm but of sound mind and disposing memory blessed by God for the same do this the fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one do make publish and declare the following paper writing to be and contain my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me made heretofore and declaring this to be the only one in manner and form following viz: 1st. my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid and they are but for by my executors hereafter named. 2nd. Item: I loan to my loving wife Mary Vick during her natural life one tract or parcel of land with all its improvements containing four or five acres be the same more or less bounded as follows beginning at a corner sassafras tree running up the old line to a copper pine thence up the old orchard bound to the old cedar tree thence round a line of marked trees to the first station, with the privileges of fine wood and clear timber on the balance of my lands that I die possessed of and at the death of my said wife, Mary Vick, I give the above named lands with all its improvements to my grand-son William Vick to him and his heirs forever. I also loan to my wife Mary Vick during her natural life and no longer the following mutual property viz: one young horse named Buck the bridle and saddle two cows and three calves two bearing two years old, household goods, furniture, food etc (these records hard to read)

All that was

looked to my said wife Mary Vick during her natural life the land excepted to be equal divided between my three children them and each of their heirs viz: Priscilla Whitfield, Patience Vick and Elijah Vick.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter ^{Priscilla} Whitfield one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my two granddaughters, the children of my son Elijah Vick ^{Ludenda} Viz: Ludenda and Mary M. V. Vick twenty five dollars each in the Aschel acres of land jointly holding the lands of Asahel Vick lying in the pine woods to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my four grand children the children of my son Josiah Vick, Viz: ^{Louisa} Louis, John, Benj. and Josiah Vick one hundred and fifty dollars to be equally divided between them all to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Vick a certain tract of land with all its improvements lying and being in the county of Nash and bounded on the following boundaries at the mouth of Askins spring ^{Nash} thence running a line of marked trees to a stone thence by a line intersected thence to a tree known as Quaker's point the dividing line between my self and the heirs of Loderick F. Ellen ^{Askins} in the stream creek running up by the creek to the first junction above one hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grand son William Vick, son of my son John Vick all the balance of my lands that I have not heretofore disposed of to him and his heirs forever. also the balance of my other desks one still and its contents one shot gun one desk one bed and furniture ^{Sider casts} one cow ^{Sow} one pig one cow and pig to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to Vilet Griffin one cow and calf one earling
the bed and furniture and dressing glass and twenty five dollars in
cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Orphine Vick daughter
of my son John Vick two hundred dollars cash to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Charity Bachelor daughter
of my son Joel Vick one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs for-
ever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my four grand children the children of my
daughter Priscilla Whitfield viz: Isaac Whitfield, John Whitfield,
Penelope Whitfield and Eli Whitfield Fifty Dollars each to them and their
heirs forever.

Item: My will and desire is that my son Elijah Vick be the agent for my
son and all our children that she has now or here
after to a sum of three hundred dollars is to be left in
Elijah Vick which sum is not to be applied by
him to the support of any of his daughters Patience
and Elizabeth and may have to be

Item: I give and bequeath to Polley Jones, one small black cow to her and her children.

Item: By will and desire is after all my just debts are paid and all the legacies already given away the balance of my estate of every description to be equally divided between all my children and the survivors of my children by seven (vis) Joel Vick's children ^{11th} part Priscilla Whitfield one ^{seventh} part Eli Vick's children one ^{seventh} part Josiah Vick's children one ^{seventh} part Nathaniel Vick one ^{seventh} part Elijah Vick one ^{seventh} part and John Vick's children one ^{seventh} part I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Elijah Vick and my two nephews ^{Sam} W. Vick and ^{Asahel} Vick executors to take my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said John Vick have hereunto set my hand and seal the year and date first above written. Signed, sealed and acknowledged and in presence of the aforesaid subscribers witnessed thereto.
