 Charles May of the other part, both of the County of Wake, and State of
 North Carolina, Witnesseth that I the said John May, for the
 natural love and affection which I bear to my son Charles
 May, have granted given Enfeoffed, and confirmed unto him
 said Charles May, his heirs a piece for ever. One Certain
 Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in said County of
 Wake, on the waters of Little Lick Creek and bounded as
 follows, Beginning at a pine on Popps old Road, running
 thence N. along Henry Evans's line, to his Corner in Wm. Evans's

 line, a small Nutmeg thence West along William Evans's line
 to a Spanish Oak, on the Bank of the little creek, thence st. to a
 Hickory thence West to a small post Oak, thence a south course
 to a maple, Absalom May's Corner, on the little Creek, thence
 down the Creek, to Pop's Rock, a white Oak, thence along said
 Road to the Beginning, Containing by Estimation fifty Acres be
 the same more or less, with all and singular the rights profits
 and priviledges, with the hereditaments and appurtenances,
 thereto in any wise appertaining or belonging, and he the
 said John May, does, agree that he will for ever warrant,
 and defende the above lands and premises, unto him said
 Charles May his heirs or assigns forever. to his and their only
 proper use and behoof forever, the lawful claim challenges
 or demands of all persons whatsoever, in witness whereof
 he the said John May has hereunto set his hand and affixed
 his Seal the day and date above written
