

John May to George (Barrfield) This Indenture made the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and ten by and between John May of the one
 part and George Barrfield of the other part, both
 of the County of Wake and State of North Carolina
 Witnesseth that the said John May for and in
 consideration of the sum of Twenty pounds, lawful
 money of said State to him in hand paid by
 said George Barrfield, the receipt whereof he hath
 fully acknowledged, and by these presents have
 bargained sold conveyed and confirmed to
 him the said George Barrfield his heirs assigns
 forever; One certain Tract or parcel of land, lying
 and being in said County of Wake and bounded
 as follows: Beginning at a red Oak in said George
 Barrfield's line, thence along his line north by side to
 Henry Charles, along corner, thence a West course along
 his line 32 poles to a red Oak sapling, thence north by
 side to a white Oak in Thomas Edwards' line, thence
 to the Beginning being by Estimation Eighty and three
 fourths of an acre be the same, more or less with all
 and singular the rights profits and appurtenances
 with the here statements and appurtenances, thence
 in any case appurtenances or belonging and be the
 said John May he does agree that he will give
 warrant and defend the same bargain as land &
 premises, unto him the said George Barrfield
 his heirs or assigns for ever to his or their only
 proper use and behoof clear and free from all
 incumbrances whatsoever, In witness whereof
 the said John May has hereunto set his hand
 and affixed his seal the day and date above
 written.
