Lloyd and Jack,

Thanks for your comments as Elizabeth being Charles first wife and mother of all his children and Margaret Brady being the second wife.

I knew that Joyce Poole listed Elizabeth as the first wife and mother of his children and Margaret Brady as his 2nd wife.

Upon further research I find in "Record-Based History of the Family of Stephen Heard of Albermarle and Pittsylvania/Henry Counties, Va." compiled by Jayce Poole. 4 April 1997 the following statement on page 29: 1795 Wilkes-Ga. Deed.Bk NN, p194. Charles Heard relinquishes all claim to 200 acres in Wilkes Co. on Fishing Cr, the said land he got by his wife Margaret Brady. (S-28, p143 note by JPP: Harold Heard on p18 of M-33: "There is ample documentation from Wilkes Co., Ga. that Charles Heard of Wilkes Co. married Margaret Brady." The point he was making here was that there are two Charles Heards; one in South Carolina during the Revolutionary War was said by Silas Wright Heard to have married a "MISS LOGAN" (FIRST NAME NOT GIVEN) and another Charles Heard who died in Wilkes Co. in 1797 who married 2nd Margaret Brady. *Margaret Ferguson - m.d. William Brady*

My source for my showing Margaret Logan as Charles C. Heard's first wife was "Georgia Revolutionary Soldiers, Sailors, Patriots, and Descendants Vol !! by Mary Carter/W.G. Regional Library.

I didn't have a copy of the above so I can't confirm what it says, but it must have been referring to the South Carolina Charles Heard.

Thanks for showing me that Elizabeth, as best as can be determined, is the correct 1st wife of our Ancestor Charles C. Heard.
