

This Indenture Made the Twenty fourth day of July in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety one Between Jacob Schuyler and his wife  
 of Pennington Township in the County of Bedford and State of Pennsylvania of the one part  
 and Valentine Horn of the Sevenfield County and State of the State aforesaid of the other  
 and witnesseth That Whereas the aforesaid Jacob Schuyler obtained a patent from the  
 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for a certain tract of land hundred and sixteen acres of land  
called Green Stock situated on Caledon's Run in the Township of Conemaugh County of  
 Bedford and State of Pennsylvania Beginning At an old wood and running thence  
 South forty seven poles to a White oak, and South thirty nine degrees East eighty four  
 poles and two hundred and two feet to a White oak, and South land and Woods land, south forty  
 two degrees East one hundred and forty three poles to a White oak branch by the road  
 hills North Sixty five degrees West one hundred and twenty seven poles and an half  
 to a post from thence to the place of Beginning (a straight line) Containing sixty  
 acres with the allowance of six per cent to the Surveyor or Surveyor's  
 thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
 ninety one which said land was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant dated the 12 August 1788  
 and record in the Office for the State of Pennsylvania in the Land book 8<sup>e</sup> page  
 125 reference thereto and being held will more fully and at large appear. Now This  
 Indenture witnesseth That they the said Jacob Schuyler and his wife for  
 and in consideration of the sum of Five pounds lawful money of Pennsylvania to them  
 in Hand paid by Valentine Horn the receipt whereof do hereby acknowledge that  
 aforesaid bargained sold assigned released and confirmed And by these presents hath granted  
 to Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns all the said aforesaid tract of land situate as  
 aforesaid together with all and singular the buildings improvements trees Woods  
 Coursers rights Liberties Privileges and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging or in any  
 wise appertaining To have and to hold the said tract or part of a tract of land Acre or  
 Land and allowance as the same is herein first before bounded and described with the  
 buildings and premises hereby granted bargained and sold or mentioned or intended  
 to be with the appurtenances unto the said Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns and for  
 the only sum of Five pounds and dñe of him the said Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns  
 power. And the said Jacob Schuyler and his wife for themselves their heirs Executors and  
 Administrators do hereby Covenant and agree to and with the said Valentine Horn  
 his heirs and assigns that the said Jacob Schuyler and his wife and their heirs  
 the hereby bargained and sold premises and every part and parcel thereof to the said  
 Valentine Horn his heirs and assigns them and their heirs shall and will forever  
 and for ever defend by these presents In witness Whereof the said parties have set  
 their hands to these presents and annexed this date the day and year first before mentioned  
 The instrument of the words which said date was signed & was

done before signing.


