

This Indenture bears Made this fourth Day of January, in the year
 1814 between John Barber of the county of Shelby
 of the one part and William Thalekill of the County of
 Mercer of the other part both of the State of Kentucky
 the said John Barber hath this day sold unto the
 Said William Thalekill for and in consideration of the
 Just and full sum twelve pounds ten Shillings both
 Bargained & sold Alien and poff and convey unto the
 Said William Thalekill Twenty five acres of land ly-
 ing in the County of Mercer on the lower side of
 Clark's run adjoining William Gainey Land on the
 Northwesterly Side and Bounded as followeth Beginning
 at a Black Oak and ash corner to a large
 Running thence North Sixty-five Degrees East with
 Gainey line one hundred and ten poles to his corner

two White Oak Trees Standing on the Cliffs of Dick's River
 Running thence up the River bending on the several Meanders
 thereof to the mouth of said Clark's Run bending thereto
 the Beginning to have & to hold to the said Thalekill & his
 executors and to their only use benefit & behoof forever and the
 Said Barber doth hereby warrant and defend the said land
 against himself & his executors and all claiming through or
 under them by Testament Whereof the said John Barber doth
 hereunto set his hand and seal the Day & Date within
 signed dealed and delivered in the present

 Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty two
 William Young and Ann his wife of the County of Allegany and
 State of Kentucky of the one part and Thurlow Shultz of
 the said County and State of the other part witnesseth that the
 William Young and Ann his wife for and consideration of the
 sum of Four hundred dollars current money of the State of
 Kentucky aforesaid to them in hand paid by the said William
 Shultz the receipt whereof they the said William Young and
 Ann his wife doth hereby acknowledge and themselves therewith
 fully satisfied and contented hath granted bargained sold alined
 and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell aline
 confirm unto the said William Shultz one certain tract
 of land containing by Survey Sixty nine acres more or
 less lying on the North of Charhouse and North west side
 of Dick's river in Monroe County and bounded as follows to wit
 Beginning at a red Oak near white Oak Soplins 838 w 130
 poles his signature & Dogwood Soplins thence 818 e po with
 Barkers line to white Oak and signature on the line on this bank
 of Clark's river thence 460 E 108 p^t to two white Oaks
 Soplins on the bank of Dick's river thence 470 E 112 p^t
 to the Beginning Sixty eight acres being so described or
 lies in the above described boundary together with all and
 belonging to the premises and improvements with the wood
 land as well as that that is bound and in having with all its
 appurtenances to have and to hold the said land
 and premises with all its appurtenances unto the said
 William Shultz and his wife for the sum of £ 100
 and to administer there of like warrant and fine before
 the aforesaid land and premises against the claim of them the
 said William Young and his wife whom hereof warning
 and admonition being given to them or either
 of them by us and their son of them and against the
 claim of any other person or persons whatsoever
 claim or claim of any other person or persons whatsoever
 shall be held by the said William Young and his
 wife William Shultz the said William Young and his
 wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators
 shall be entitled to all the land and all the estate
 and term first within written by me Justice of the Peace
 and Notary public in the premises of this day of January
 A.D. One thousand eight hundred and Sixty two
