The Last Will &c. In the name of God Amen, I John Chambers of the township of Lower Southfield in the County of Northampton and Dominion of Devon being of sound mind memory and understanding (Blessed be God for the same) but considering the uncertainty of this transitory life do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit. First I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Elizabeth Swann and Elizabeth each of them the different lots that has been laid off and subdivided to them their heirs and assigns forever. I give and bequeath to my son to wit all the remaining part of my farm which is below the hill false give and bequeath unto him all my remaining timber land on the hill and against the hill to him his heirs and assigns forever. And further I give and bequeath unto John Chambers the son of my daughter Elizabeth and to John Chambers son of my son Charles all my right claim and remainder to an estate lying in the town below and adjoining me to each of them an equal half. I give and bequeath unto my grand son William Mills thirty five dollars in cash. I give and bequeath to my grand son John Deppin in cash to be left in the hands of my executor his heirs and assigns forever. I give and bequeath unto my three daughters just named all my household goods to be equally divided among them also my cash that may remain also my gold that may remain to be equally divided among my four children. And lastly I do nominate constitute and appoint my servants and friends Daniel Cabaro to be the executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of September one thousand and nine hundred and thirty four in the presence of James Sheddaker, Benjamin Steller Northampton County ss. On the 22nd day of June A.D. 1810 before me Nathaniel Clerk of the Register for the probate of wills in and for the County of said said county Daniel Steller one of the witnesses to the within will and testament of John Chambers deceased and on the 6th day of July A.D. 1810 personally appeared before me the said Nathaniel Clerk Benjamin Steller the other subscribing witness to the within last will and testament and being duly and solemnly sworn on the holy evangelists of Almighty God agreeably to know the truth respectively and depose declare and say that they were personally present at the execution of the within written will and testament and did see the testator John Chambers sign and seal the said will and heard him publish and declare the same to be his last will and testament and that at the time of so doing he was of sound mind memory and understanding to the best of these deponents knowledge and belief. And also that they signed the same as witnesses at the request of the said testator and in his presence and in the presence of each other. These my husband Nathaniel's Register.

The Last Will &c. In the name of God Amen, I George Haas of Allen Township in the County of Northampton and State of Pennsylvania being of sound mind memory and understanding do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First I do revoke all my debts and funeral expenses to be honorably paid and discharged by my executor hereinafter named. Then I do hereby give grant devise and bequeath unto my two sons George and John all that my share plantation and tract of land which is now under situate in Allen Township adjacent adjoining lands of John Bassef and Abraham Deane the younger Henry Deppin to the like two lands of Henry Deppin Henry Haas William Deppin and Daniel Deppin containing about one hundred and forty two acres of land to be the same now or to be parcel thereof being part of one hundred and eighty four acres and twenty parcels of land which Mr. Deane and Daniel Deppin his wife by indenture under their hands and seals the said Henry Deppin and Daniel Deppin

according to tenacity. It shall be in George and John and their heirs and assigns forever. I do hereby give grant devise and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth all that my share plantation and tract of land which is now under situate in Allen Township adjacent adjoining lands of John Bassef and Abraham Deane the younger Henry Deppin to the like two lands of Henry Deppin Henry Haas William Deppin and Daniel Deppin containing about one hundred and forty two acres of land to be the same now or to be parcel thereof being part of one hundred and eighty four acres and twenty parcels of land which Mr. Deane and Daniel Deppin his wife by indenture under their hands and seals the said Henry Deppin and Daniel Deppin
