 and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say I give
 freely and just of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the
 hand of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I recommend
 to the same God and as touching such worldly Estate where with
 it has pleased God to bless me in this Life I give devise in form
 and Manner following I Will I give and Bequeath to my
 Two Sons Henry & Jacob all the Interest due and to become
 Due as long as I live, which is Due on Bonds, Annuities
 in all to Sixteen Hundred Pounds which I have in hand
 of my said Two Sons as by a certain Agreement Dated the
 Thirtieth Day of June Anno Domini 1742. may appear, and
 also it is my Will that the above said Sixteen Hundred Pounds
 shall be paid in Thirteen yearly payments in Manner following
 and no sooner, the first payment of Two hundred Pounds is to
 be made four weeks after my Decease to my two Daughters
 Catharina Brodman and Anna Hillig as in Equal Shares, the
 second payment is to be made one year after my Decease and
 likewise Two hundred Pounds to my two Sons Henry & Jacob in
 Equal Share, the third payment of Two hundred pounds is to
 be made the third year after my Decease to my two Daughters
 Anna Mary Stanzel, and Udelhit Widner in Equal Shares,
 the fourth payment of one Hundred pounds is to be made the
 fourth year after my Decease to my above said Catharina Brodman
 and so forth according to their seniority of Birth till Twelve
 Hundred pounds is fully paid, and at the my Will that the
 residue of four hundred pounds shall be divided amongst
 my above said Daughters and Sons as following Two hundred
 pounds thereof is to be divided among my above said four
 Daughters in Equal Shares, and the two last payments of two
 hundred pounds is to be divided between my above said two
 Sons in Equal Shares the last said four Hundred pounds is to be
 paid annually one Hundred pounds after the above said twelve
 hundred pounds is paid I further give and devise to my said
 Two Sons Henry and Jacob their heirs and assigns all my land
 which I claim and hold whatsoever, to them the said Jacob and
 Henry their heirs and assigns forever AND Lastly as to all the
 rest and remainder of my Personal Estate goods and Chattels of
 what kind soever at is my Will that it shall be equally be
 divided among my above said six Children I do hereby
 order and appoint my son in Law Frederick Hillig as and

My Son Henry Joint Executors of this my Last will and Testament and also authorize the said Frederick Hilligan to Execute a Deed to my said two Sons for all the Land I conveyed & devised to them Henry took in all former wills by me made, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Fifteenth Day of February in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety One.

Personally appeared David Spinner & George Mitchel the Subscribing witnesses to the foregoing Instrument of writing and on their Solemn affirmation did say that they were personally present at the Execution thereof and saw and heard Henry Huber make his mark seal Publish & declare the same as and for his last will and Testament and at the time of his so doing he was of Sound mind & Memory and of a disposing understanding to the best of their Knowledge & Belief.
