W<sup>e</sup>bberlightt, being sick and weake in Bodie but of Perfect mind  
and Memory. I<sup>s</sup> blessed be the Almighty God for the same, do make <sup># 2826</sup>  
and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say further:  
I<sup>t</sup> is my first part of all I give and recommend my Soul unto the  
hand of Almighty God that gave it and my Bodie I recommend  
to the Earth and as toucheth such worldly Estate w<sup>t</sup>ch w<sup>t</sup>tho  
it has pleased God to blesse me in this life I give devise in form  
and manner following. Item I give and bequeath to my  
Two Sons Henry & Jacob all the Interest due and to become  
Due as long as alive, which is Due on bonds, Amounting  
in all to Sixteen Hundred Pounds which I have in hand  
of my said Two Sons as by a certaine Agreement Dated the  
Thirtieth Day of June Anno, Domini 1793, may appear, and  
also it is my will that the above said Sixteen Hundred Pounds  
shall be paid in Thirteen Sundry payments in manner following  
and no sooner, the first payment of two hundred Pounds is to  
be made four weeks after my Decease to my two Daughters  
Catharina Brodman and Anna Hilligas in equal shares, the  
second payment is to be made one year after my Decease and  
likewise two hundred Pounds to my two Sons Henry & Jacob in  
equal share, the third payment of two hundred pounds is to  
be made the third year after my Decease to my two Daughters  
Anna Mary Hartzel, and Catharina Widmer in equal shares,  
the fourth payment of one hundred pounds is to be made the  
fourth payment of one hundred pounds is to be made the fourth  
year after my Decease to my above said Catharina Brodman  
and so forth according to their seniority of Birth till twelve  
Hundred pounds is fully paid, and at his my will that the  
Residue of four hundred pounds shall be divided amongst  
my above said Daughters and Sons as following Two hundred  
pounds thereof is to be devideed among my above said four  
Daughters in equal shares, and the two last payments of two  
hundred pounds is to be devideed between my above said two  
Sons in equal shares the last said four hundred pounds is to be  
paid annually one hundred pounds after the above said twelve  
hundred pounds is paid I further give and devise to my said  
Two Sons Henry and Jacob their heirs and assigns all my land  
which I claim and hold whatsoever, to them if the said Jacob and  
Henry their heirs and assigns forever AND Lastly but to all the  
rest and remainder of my Personal Estate goods and Chattels of  
what kind soever at my will that at shall be equally the  
Divideed among my above said six Children I do hereby  
order and Appoint my Son in Law Frederick Hilligas and

7. My Son Henry joint Executrix of this my Last will and  
 Testament and also authorise the said Frederick Hilligan  
 to execute a Deed to my said two Sons for all the Land I convey  
 & devised to them Henry Lewin in all former wills by me made,  
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and  
 Seal the Fifteenth Day of February in the Year of our Lord  
 One Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety One.

After the Interlining between them, HENRY Huber <sup>mark</sup> <sup>seal</sup>  
 fourth and fifth lines were done before the executing of this will  
 signed Sealed published and declared by the above-  
 named Henry Huber to be his last will and Testament in  
 the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our Names  
 as witnesses in the presence of the Testators David Spiner,  
 George Mitchell

BROCKEL Jr., in WO, 109<sup>th</sup> 1798. Personally appeared David  
 Spiner & George Mitchell the Subscribing witnesses to the  
 foregoing Instrument of writing and of their Solemn affi-  
 -mations did say that they were personally present at the execu-  
 -tion thereof and saw and heard Henry Huber make his mark  
 seal Publish & declare the same as and for his last will and Tes-  
 -tament and at the time of his so doing he was of sound mind  
 memory and of a disposing understanding to the best of  
 their knowledge & belief.
