Last Will &
of
Henry Hoover dec'd
Dated Oct 14 1828

In the name of God Amen I Henry Hoover of the Township of Williams in the
County of Northampton and Commonwealth of Pennsylvaniaerman being weak in
body but of sound mind memory and understanding and considering the uncertainty
of this mortal life and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs do make and
publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit

Principally and first of all I command my immortal soul into the hands of God who gave and my body to the
earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors herein named And as to such worldly
estate whereunto it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following man-
ner to wit I give to my loving wife Susannah for as long as shall live after my decease all my Household
goods and furniture in my Hands in which I now live in the Township aforesaid likewise all the live stock

on the Premises and One Hundred Dollars if it is wanted and after her decease to be equally divided among my Children - And I give to my Son Bartholomew one Waggon and two Old Horses and all the gear belonging thereto and the Slop House which he has now in use. - And I give to my daughter Christiana Doctor the House & Lot of about Thirty Acres with all the Improvements thereon which she now Occupies to be hers after her decease should the same no provision be made to be equally divided among her Brothers and Sisters - And I also give to my Daughter Catherine the sum of ~~Two~~^{Ten} Hundred Dollars in three equal payments to be paid by my Executrix likewise Two Pairs of Gloves one Drawe one Bureau one Windsor Chair and Two Tablets Table and other reasonable Outfit etc. And I hereby nominate and appoint my Sons Henry & Bartholomew Hoover Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Tenth day of May One Thousand eight hundred and twenty seven. Henry Hoover Seal signed Sealed and acknowledged by the Testator in the presence of the Subscribers as his Last Will and Testament. Anthony Trausse - Daniel Offerback - Northampton County Esq. On the 22nd day of October A.D. 1828 Before me Charles L Eberle Deputy Register Esq. in and for said County personally appeared Abraham Painter who being duly sworn did depose and say that the alteration in the will in Article from Thirteen to twelve was done in his presence and at the request of Henry Hoover the Testator which named and further saith not. Abraham Painter - Sworn and Subscribed before me the day and Year aforesaid - Chas. L. Eberle Esq. - Northampton County Esq. On the 24th day of October A.D. 1828 Before me Charles L Eberle Deputy Register Esq. in and for said County came Anthony Trausse and on the 20th day of the same month came Daniel Offerback the subscribing Witnesses to the preceding Last Will and Testament of Henry Hoover deceased and being duly sworn did depose and say that they were personally present saw and heard the said Henry Hoover the Testator sign seal publish and declare the same to be his Last Will and Testament that at the time of so doing he was of sound mind memory and understanding to the best of their knowledge and belief and that they signed the same as Witnesses at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other. Witness my Hand - Chas. L. Eberle Esq. - On the 20th of Oct. Letters Testamentary were granted to Henry & Bartholomew Hoover the Executors above named. Chas. L. Eberle Esq.
