In the name of God Amen I Henry Hoover of the Township of Williams in the
 County of Northampton and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania being weak in
 body but of sound mind memory and understanding and considering the uncertainty
 of this mortal life and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs do make and
 Publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit
 Principally and first of all I commend my immortal soul into the hands of God who gave and my body to the
 earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors herein named. And as to such worldly
 estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following man-
 ner to wit: I give to my loving wife Susannah for as long as shall live after my decease all my Household
 goods and furniture in my House in which I now live in the Township aforesaid likewise all the live stock

on the Frames and One Hundred Dollars if it is wanted and after his decease to be equally divided among my children - And I give to my Son Bartholomew one Waggon and two Old Horses and all the gears belonging thereto and the paper stove which he has now in use - And I give to my daughter Christina Docton the Horse & Lot of about thirty Acres with all the Improvements thereon which she now occupies to be hers after his decease should she leave no children of hers to be equally divided among her Brothers and Sisters - And I also give to my Daughter Catharine the sum of ^{Twenty} ~~Twenty~~ Hundred Dollars in three equal payments to be paid by my Executors like unto Two fows. Three good Beds one Drawer one Bureau six Windsor Chairs and Two Tables Table and other reasonable Outset &c. And I hereby nominate and appoint my Sons Henry & Bartholomew Hoovers Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Tenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and twenty seven. Henry Hoover Test Signed Sealed and acknowledged by the Testator in the presence of the Subscribers as his Last Will and Testament. Anthony Trammie - Daniel Afflerbach - Northampton County, Js. On the 22^d day of October A.D. 1828 Before me Charles L. Abraham Painter - Sworn and subscribed before me the day and Year aforesaid - Chas. Eberle DC - Northampton County Js. On the 24th day of October A.D. 1828. Before me Charles L. Eberle Deputy Register &c. in and for said County came Anthony Trammie and on the 22^d day of the same month came Daniel Afflerbach the subscribing Witnesses to the preceding Last Will and Testament of Henry Hoover deceased and being duly sworn did depose and say that they were personally present saw and heard the said Henry Hoover the Testator sign seal publish and declare the same to be his Last Will and Testament that at the time of so doing he was of sound mind memory and understanding to the best of their knowledge and belief and that they signed the same as Witnesses at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other.
