

Peter Wilson came to Allegheny county in 1777-78, from Ireland, and removed from there to Mercer county, in 1797, with his wife and two children, George and James. Both boys were born in Allegheny county, George 1792. Wilson first settled in Jackson township, where he built the first if in the township, and afterward, about 1798 or 1800, removed to Worth township, and located where his son, James, now lives. When the family first came to Jackson township, Indians frequently encamped along the creek, west of where they lived, and were, no doubt, part of those who had their villages at Mercer, the Big Bend of the Shenango, and Pine Swamp, lying partially in the present townships of Lake, Seedy Lake, Jackson, and Worth. An Indian trail ran through from Mercer to Franklin, and, after the Wilsons came to the county, a road was opened on the same route, and continued through to Greenville.

About 1799, a daughter (Mary) was born to Mr. and Mrs. Wilson, and was, probably, the first white child born in the present limits of Worth township. John Wilson was the youngest of the family, and owned the farm, now belonging to his heirs, adjoining Millbrook on the west.

Peter Wilson, a Revolutionary soldier, came to the township in 1796 or 1797, and bought a settler's right of a Mr. Spencer, to the farm now owned by James Dougherty. Mr. Wilson came from Ireland to Allegheny county, 1777-78, and in that county his two sons, George and James, were born, former in 1792. These two children and his wife, accompanied Mr. Wilson when he came to Mercer county. Indians were still very pleaty in the neighborhood, there being at that time three villages in the county, the largest consisting of some sixty or eighty lodges, at Mercer, and the others at the Big Bend of the Shenango, and what is yet known as "Pine Swadp," lying partially in the north-east corner of Jackson township. They frequently encamped in small parties along the creeks in the vicinity, and made the country around their hunting ground, as it absunded with great numbers of deer, bears, panthers, and smaller game, which both Indians and whits waged an unceasing war against. The result is, that to day about the largest game to be found is the gray squirred and partiridge. The Indian raver all.

A man named Penn is said to have been the original patentee of the P Wilson farm, in Worth township; and a man named Doyle was also put the farm by Penn, to perfect his right. Doyle made considerable of a dig. and built a cabin near a fine spring, which still flows. He also plans small patch of corn, which was probably the finest in the township. Jane Wilson was born next after Mary, and both are now dead. It eldest two children, George and James, are yet living—James on the homestead, in Worth township, and George on a farm where he settled, I Jackson township, in 1813, just after his return from the War of 1812. Gorg Wilson married Mary, a daughter of George McPhetridge, one was an earl settler in Hempfield township, two miles east of Greenville. McPhetridge farm joined the one owned by Colonel Andrew Christy.

The Wilsons were among the first settlers in the county, and, with the Stokelys, Zahnisers, McClures, Carmichaels, Westlakes, Carrolls, and other, formed an intelligent community, very different from most border settlements; and the accomplishments of the father have, also, fallen to the lat

borhood, and probably in the county. Wilson traded the farm to a man pamed Lattleford, in 1798-99, and removed to what is now Worth township. "titleford left the country about 1812. The Wilson mill was an exceedingly

sitive affair, and used "country-stone," made from the flinty rock bowlders, which abounded. It is told by those who remember them, that the grists were always full of grit, which had worn off the soft mill-stones.

Mr. Wilson's son, George, settled on the place where he now lives, in the getern part of the township, in 1813, just after his return from the army, in which he had served during the War of 1812 with Great Britain. He married Mary McPhetridge, in 1815. Her father, George McPhetridge, settled in what is now Hempfield township, two miles east of Greenville, and his farm joined the one owned by Colonel Andrew Christy. James Wilson also served in the army in 1812.

John Armstrong came out with Peter Wilson when a small boy, and soon after went lack to Pittsburgh, and learned the blacksmith's trade. He came to Beaver Falls (then called Old Brighton), and worked at blacksmithing to 1819, when he came to Mercer county and settled. He arrived in the township of Cool Spring, now Jackson, on the 19th of September, 1819, and settled on the farm where James Dougherty now lives (the Wilson farm,


