KNOW all Men by these Presents, That we James
 Salthouse of the Town of Salford
 Manchester in the County of Lancaster
 & Diocese of Chester, Merchant, and
 Jonathan Littlewood of the same place
 Parish-maker
 are holden and firmly bound unto the Right Reverend Father in
 God William by Divine Permission, Lord
 Bishop of Chester in the Sum of Five hundred Pounds
 of good and lawful Money of Great Britain, to be paid unto the
 said Right Reverend Father, his lawful Executors, Administrators,
 or Assigns in which Payment we have agreed to
 be made, we bind ourselves and each of us jointly and severally
 to the whole, our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, and the Heirs,
 Executors, and Administrators of each of us firmly by these Presents
 Sealed with our Seals, and dated the Fifth Day of
 July in the Fifth Year of the Reign of
 our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth King of Great Britain,
 France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, and in the Year
 of our Lord God, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety five

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, that if the above-
 bounden James Salthouse and Jonathan Littlewood
 now licensed to be married together, be neither
 of Contingency, or Affinity, the one to the other, within the De-
 grees prohibited for Marriage: It also there be no Bar or Impedi-
 ment, by Reason of any Precontract, entered into before the Twenty-
 fifth Day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty
 Four, or any other lawful Cause whatsoever, but that they may be
 lawfully married together, both by the Laws of GOD, and this
 Land: Moreover, if the Persons, whose Consent is required by
 Law in this Behalf, be thereto assenting: And lastly, if the said
 Marriage be done and solemnized in such Manner, as in the Licence
 to them granted is limited: Then this Obligation to be void, or
 else to remain in full Force and Virtue
